I am pleased to present the 2017 REFORMA Colorado Conference Financial Summary Report (attached). In addition to generating a profit of over \$2,000, the 2017 conference was memorable for a number of reasons, including the following:

- 2017 was the 5<sup>th</sup> annual conference of REFORMA Colorado
- This was the first time it was held at the Auraria campus in downtown Denver
  - Special thanks to Denver Public Library for hosting the 4 previous conferences
- 2017 was the first all-day conference; previous gatherings were known as "mini-conferences"
- 13 presentations by 18 presenters (very high evaluation scores overall)
- 7 exhibitors (CLiC, Emporia State University, Lorito Books, MiCasa Resource Center, Barrio E', Colorado Talking Book Library, Littleton Immigrant Resources Center)
- 3 major financial contributors (CLiC, Emporia State University School of Library & Information Management, Auraria Library)
- Outstanding entertainment by Barrio E'; excellent Caribbean lunch provided by La Caribena/Casa Kiskeya
- Approximately 90 attendees (includes paid attendees, presenters, exhibitors, donors)
- The 2017 conference generated a net-profit of \$2060.54

In August 2017 the REFORMA Colorado Chapter officers voted to make a \$500 contribution to the 6<sup>th</sup> REFORMA National Conference (RNCVI), San Juan, Puerto Rico. We provided financial support because of our ability to do so (our healthy bank account is now in excess of \$7,000) and because several of our fellow REFORMA chapters made similar contributions to the conference when our Colorado Chapter hosted RNCIV in Denver, September 2011, Westin Hotel.

A few weeks ago our Chapter received an acknowledgement letter thanking us for our contribution (PDF attached).
